<p>Qur'an – The Islamic sacred text revealed to Prophet Muhammad by Allah.</p> <p>Allah – Arabic for God.</p> <p>Prophet Muhammad - an Islamic leader who was believed to be God's (Allah's) messenger.</p> <p>Wudu - washing to be performed to prepare for prayer and worship.</p> <p>Imam – the leader of prayer in a Mosque.</p> <p>Minaret – the tower on a Mosque which can be used for the call of prayer.</p> <p>Mihrab – shows the direction to Makkah and the way that Muslims face when praying.</p> <p>Salah – daily prayers performed five times a day by Muslims.</p>	<p>Shabbat - the Jewish Day of Rest celebrated each week from sunset on Friday to sunset on Saturday.</p> <p>Chanukah (Hanukkah) – Jewish festival of light.</p> <p>Menorah – seven branched lamp</p> <p>Mezuzah – a scroll placed on doorposts of Jewish homes which reminds them of God.</p> <p>Torah Scroll - The Jewish Holy Scripture</p> <p>Jesus – believed to be the Son of God.</p>	<p>Holy – related to a religion or a god.</p> <p>Parables -Stories from the Bible that have special meanings and help Christians learn.</p> <p>Bible – Christian Holy book.</p> <p>Qur'an – Muslim Holy book</p> <p>Torah Scroll – The Jewish Holy Scripture</p>	<p>Genesis -The first book of the Bible for Christians and the Torah for followers of the Jewish faith.</p> <p>Sukkot –</p> <p>Unique – one of a kind</p> <p>Environment – the space in which we live.</p> <p>Tzedekah - Charitable giving for Jewish people.</p> <p>Creator - Someone who makes something new.</p>
