They stick together, they are one under Allah.	Zakat is the duty of all Muslims, who can afford it, to give money to help the poor.	Some people believe that death is the end of life, and that there is no afterlife.
Christians believe humans are made in the image of God.	Hindus are committed to Ahimsa, or harmlessness. They try to live life without killing or harming anything that lives.	The teachings of Jesus and the Churches say that Christians should use their money to help remove poverty and suffering.	Most religious traditions teach about some form of life after death, which can bring comfort to people as they face suffering.
