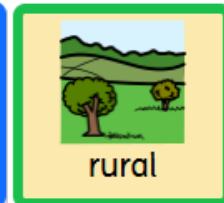
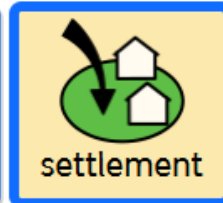


Key Vocabulary
