<b>Census</b>	The process by which a government counts its people.
<b>Chimney sweep</b>	A job that involved climbing into people's chimneys to clean them.
<b>Empire</b>	A group of territories or peoples under one ruler.
<b>Era</b>	An important period in history.
<b>Industrial Revolution</b>	A time of major change in the way products were made.
<b>Manufacture</b>	To make many of something quickly, in a factory using machinery.
<b>Mine</b>	A pit or tunnel from which minerals such as coal are taken.
<b>Poor Law</b>	A law passed in 1834 which ensured that the poor were housed in workhouses, clothed and fed.
<b>Population</b>	The number of people living in a place or country.
<b>Poverty</b>	Being extremely poor.
<b>Queen Victoria</b>	The British monarch who reigned from 1837 to 1901.
<b>Ragged schools</b>	Schools set up by charities to educate poor Victorian children.
<b>Textile Mill</b>	A building with machinery for creating textile such as yarn and fabric.
<b>Victorian era</b>	The period of time when Queen Victoria was the monarch of Great Britain.
<b>Work House</b>	A public institution where the poor were allowed to live in return for work.
