Trinity - Three persons in one God: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Parable - is a short and simple story that teaches a religious or moral lesson as told by Jesus. The Holy Bible - Christian's holy book. Christians - people that believe in the religion Christianity. Jesus Christ - The Son of God. Christian - a follower of the teachings of Jesus.	Baptism – A Christian welcoming ceremony where Holy water is sprinkled over the head.  Brit Bat – A Jewish ceremony to welcome and name baby girls.  Faith Community – A group of people who share the same religious beliefs.  Shabbat - the Jewish Day of Rest.  Challah bread – Jewish braided bread as a sign of being together.  Ceremony – an event to celebrate a special occasion.	Sacred - Something that is believed to be holy and to have a special connection with God.  Church – Christian Place of worship.
